EASTER SUNDAY YEAR B 4 APRIL 2021

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: I have risen, and I am with you still, alleluia. You have laid your hand upon me, alleluia. Too wonderful for me is this knowledge, alleluia, alleluia.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Alleluia, alleluia! Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord. Alleluia!

THE GOSPEL: John 20:1-9

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Christ our Passover has been sacrificed, alleluia; therefore, let us keep the feast with the unleavened bread of purity and truth, alleluia, alleluia.

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS: By Father John

"We are an Easter people, and our song is Alleluia!" (St John Chrysostom)
This is a magnificent summary of our Easter Faith.

We don't need heretical gnostic ideas dressed up as historical fiction; indeed, we do not need to go beyond the Scriptures and our living Tradition: for in them is a wealth of spirituality that has created countless holy men and women (saints) down through the ages. We don't need to dress up our Faith, thinking that something new, something fanciful, will attract.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad.

SECOND READING: Colossians 3:1-4

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

THE SEQUENCE: ON THE REVERSE SIDE

The simple Truth is sufficient!

And, indeed, it is still more than most accept and put in to practice. This Day of Resurrection is a day of great celebration, which renews our Faith and strengthens the love of Christ poured into our hearts at Baptism.

It is our Easter Day, which calls us to greater and greater love for God and neighbour, in imitation of the unconditional love of the Lord.

Let's rejoice in the sense of New Life which is ours at this time, and let us strive to be joyful at all times and in all circumstances of life, for only then will we truly be "an Easter people" and our song will always be "Alleluia! Praise the Lord!"

May I take this opportunity to wish each and every one of you a Happy and Blessed Easter; on behalf of Fr Abraham, Christine and Jennifer - may the Good Lord keep you safe and well, gifting you all with renewed vigour in your Faith this Easter! My thanks to those many people who have worked so hard over the past weeks and days to make our celebrations of these key liturgies such a wonderful and prayerful time.

And may we always be faithful followers of the Lord Jesus Christ, whose Death and Resurrection makes us who we are... God bless you all
