ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: The merciful love of the Lord fills the earth; by the word of the Lord the heavens were made, alleluia.

FIRST READING: Acts 4:8-12

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Peter said: 'Rulers of the people, and today about an act of kindness to a cripple, and asking us how he was healed, then I am glad to tell you all, and would indeed be glad to tell the whole people of Israel, that it was by the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarene, the one you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by this name and by no other that this man is able to stand up perfectly be only one flock and one shepherd. healthy, here in your presence, today. This is the stone rejected by you the builders, but which has the names in the world given to men, this is the only one by which we can be saved.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone.

SECOND READING: 1 John 3:1-2

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children: and that is what we are. Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us. My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is.

Alleluia, GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord; I know my sheep, and mine know me. Alleluia!

THE GOSPEL: John 10:11-18

Jesus said: 'I am the good REFLECTION ON THE READINGS: shepherd: the good shepherd is one By Father John. who lavs down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf elders! If you are questioning us attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep.

> I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as This was at the heart of the early preaching the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will

The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay proved to be the keystone. For of all it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'

> **COMMUNION ANTIPHON: The Good** Shepherd has risen, who laid down his life for his sheep and willingly died for his flock, alleluia.

> NOTE: Today is often referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday where we pray particularly for vocations, yet we too, being the 25th of April, remember ANZAC Day. As today is a Sunday in Easter (the Resurrection), the prayers and readings for the Mass are for the 4th Sunday of Easter. A commemoration is unable to take the place of a Sunday in Easter. We nevertheless remember Australian men and women who served their country in times of war and peace.



In the texts chosen for this 'Good Shepherd Sunday' Jesus, rejected by the leaders of Israel, has proven to be the keystone to the whole edifice of faith in God. Indeed, by laying down his life for humankind, Jesus has shown himself to be the True Shephard (Carer, Leader, Guide) of faith-filled people.

of the Church....and it has a consequence for us all: those who accept Jesus as the keystone of faith, as the Good Shepherd, as the Son of God.. are called and become a reality 'children of God' . And our destiny is then assured: we shall see God face to face.

Our texts this week continue to give us hope. They encourage us in our faith. And they inspire us to imitate the Good Shepherd, and to be people of unconditional love.

ST. JOSEPH THE WORKER: This coming Saturday, May 1, is the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker. Established by Pope Ven. Pius XII in 1955 to counter the communists 'may day' secular celebration it also had another key purpose - to increase devotion to the saint who was the model of workers, providing for his wife Mary and foster son Jesus.
