Jesus said to his disciples: 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my in his love. I have told you this so that my own joy may be in you and your joy be complete. This is my commandment: love one another, as I have loved you. A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends. You are my friends, if not call you servants any more, because a servant does not know his master's business; I call you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. You did not choose me: no, I chose you; and I commissioned you to go out and to bear fruit, fruit that

will last; and then the Father will

give you anything you ask him in my

name. What I command you is to

love one another.'

All three Readings for this Sixth knelt at his feet and prostrated so that we could have life through Sunday of Easter (B) speak to us of 'Love': the unconditional love ('agape') that the Lord has for us all.

> This love enabled the Lord to lay down his life for the salvation of all; indeed, it is this unconditional love which drove Jesus throughout his Life.

And it is this same love which must be at the basis of every Christian's life.

How does this pan out in reality?

Each one of us knows the ways that we are called by God to be loving people who care for others, even those who persecute us.

The Scriptures challenge us to look at our life now and ask ourselves how we can improve out interaction with our neighbour.

Where are those areas in which hate or envy or jealousy or any form of negative emotion must be converted and destroyed, so that 'agape' love can replace them?

Are we will to ask for the Spirit's loving aid in this continual process of conversion?

Let's reflect on the New Commandment of the Lord Jesus, given to all disciples who wish to walk in his footsteps: "Love one another, as I have loved you".
