ENTRANCE ANTIPHON: Blessed be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown his merciful love.

FIRST READING: Deut 4:32-34,39-49

Moses said to the people: 'Put this question to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors – all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt?'

'Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: the Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today, so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever.'

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Happy the people the Lord has chosen to be his own.

SECOND READING: Romans 8:14-17

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The

Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Alleluia, alleluia! Glory be to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit: to God who is, who was, and who is to come. Alleluia!

THE GOSPEL: Matthew 28:16-20

The eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had arranged to meet them. When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And know that I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: Since you are children of God, God has sent into your hearts the Spirit of his Son, the Spirit who cries out Abba, Father.



REFLECTION ON THE READINGS:

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ Today's Feast of the Holy Trinity celebrates our Faith in God who is One, yet relates to humankind in a variety of ways: as Father (Creator, Source of all Being, the Almighty One); as Son (God's Revelation = the Word of God, the incarnate One who is God and Human, the Mediator between God and humankind); and as the Holy Spirit (the other Advocate (Paraclete), the Gift of Grace, the One who animates us to be people who live in the image of our God).

From the earliest times of our Church's existence Christians have understood God to be One yet Three. Matthew's Gospel, written we believe in the 80's AD, contains the Great Commission: "Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit".

Our Baptism brings us into relationship with the God of Perfect Love... the beginning of our Sacramental journey is, thus, a triune or trinitarian event! As we celebrate this magnificent mystery of our Faith, let's ask the Father to send the Spirit into us once again, so that we will be enabled to grasp the Truth revealed to us by the Son, Jesus Christ. Furthermore, in our times of prayer in this coming week, let's allow ourselves to be immersed in the Life of God, who is a community of perfect Love!

Please continue to pray for the 14 young people who are making their First Communion next Sunday during the 9:30am Mass at Sacred Heart and the 10am Mass at St Canice's. Also, after the 10am St Canice's Mass there will be a short outside procession of the Blessed Sacrament concluding with Benediction in the church, a worthy way to celebrated the Feast of Corpus Christi.
