FR. JOHN'S REFLECTION.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

The texts from Scripture for this weekend encourage us to trust in God's goodness, and to surrender the all-too-human tendency to grasp at control of our existence.

The Gospel parables of the Seed Growing without Human Effort and the Mustard Seed remind us that everything is not all up to us! Indeed, God plays an essential part in the unfolding of life - which is all part of God's Plan!

Paul captures some of this when he encourages the Corinthians to trust in God, for whatever happens (even death!) God will never desert us.

And Ezekiel also speaks of this theme of trust when the Prophet reminds the People of Israel that God is the one who chose them and that God does what He promises: "I, the Lord, have spoken; and I will do it!"

One of the major challenges of the spiritual life is the concept of TRUST. Our human condition (and the circumstances of our lives) play a big part in the anxieties of life; and yet Jesus always challenges us to be like the birds of the air or the flowers in the field, placing all of our experiences under the control of our loving God.

In the week ahead, let's try to allow God to be the centre of our existence (rather than ourselves). After all, God is in heaven looking lovingly on the world He created... let's live as if we really do believe this truth!



11TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

ENTRANCE O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to you; be my help. Do not abandon or forsake me, O God my Saviour.

FIRST READING Ezekiel 17:22-24.

The Lord says this: 'From the top of the cedar, from the highest branch I will take a shoot and plant it myself on a very high mountain. I will plant it on the high mountain of Israel. It will sprout branches and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar. Every kind of bird will live beneath it, every winged creature rest in the shade of its branches. And every tree of the field will learn that I, the Lord, am the one who stunts tall trees and makes the low ones grow, who withers green trees and makes the withered green. I, the Lord, have spoken, and I will do it.'

RESPONSE Lord, it is good to give thanks to you.

SECOND READING 2 Corinthians 5:6-10.

We are always full of confidence when we remember that to live in the body means to be exiled from the Lord, going as we do by faith and not by sight - we are full of confidence, I say, and actually want to be exiled from the body and make our home with the Lord. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing him. For all the truth about us will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he deserves for the things he did in the body, good or bad.

ACCLAMATION Alleluia, alleluia! The seed is the word of God, Christ is the sower; all who come to him will live for ever. Alleluia!

THE GOSPEL Mark 4:26-34.

Jesus said to the crowds: 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time: he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.

COMMUNION There is one thing I ask of the Lord, only this do I seek: to live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.
