FR. JOHN'S REFLECTION.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

The Readings from Scripture for this Sunday encourage us to put away the old yeast of sinful lives and embrace the New Bread of Life, Christ our Lord.

He is the Bread come down from heaven who gives us New Life in all its fullness; and this fact gives us HOPE.

In the midst of crisis (including this latest Lockdown), Christians remain hope-filled people who know our Lord is working to bring about the fullness of life for us NOW, as well as in the future.

Yet, this fullness of life is not ours by magic! Like Paul reminds his Ephesian converts, we must take on the responsibilities that come with the New Life offered to us.

And the first responsibility is to take care of OURSELVES: and we do this by dying to sin, so as to be alive to Christ Jesus.

And another responsibility that is ours is to make certain we share the Good News with others, leading them to this New Life in Christ; indeed, Moses had to point out the manna to the Israelites who couldn't recognise what was offered to them by God; and so, we, too, need to point out the New Bread from Heaven to a world grown insensitive and blind.

In the week ahead let's examine those areas of our lives that may be barriers to the New Life that Christ offers us; and let's tear down those barriers!

Let's throw out the old yeast of sin and embrace the true Bread of Life. And this will aid us in helping others in need.

As the Lord reminds us:

"I am the bread of life. The one who comes to me will never be hungry; the one who believes in me will never thirst".

As we enter another month of lockdown let's never stop praying for one another... In this simple way we can take care of ourselves and support others.

Let's try and call our family and friends more often, making contact that aids our basic human needs.

And let's call our fellow parishioners as well, supporting our spiritual family with our care and concern.

Fr Abraham and I are continuing our prayers for you all in these days of trial. Let us never waver but remain hope-filled Christians at all times and in every way possible!



18TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

ENTRANCE O God, come to my assistance; O Lord, make haste to help me! You are my rescuer, my help; O Lord, do not delay.

FIRST READING Exodus 16: 2-4, 12-15

The whole community of the sons of Israel began to complain against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our heart's content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!' Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion; I propose to test them in this way to see whether they will follow my law or not.

'I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have bread to your heart's content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God."

And so it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That' said Moses to them 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.'

<u>RESPONSE</u> The Lord gave them bread from heaven.

SECOND READING Ephesians 4:17, 20-24

I want to urge you in the name of the Lord, not to go on living the aimless kind of life that pagans live. Now that is hardly the way you have learnt from Christ, unless you failed to hear him properly when you were taught what the truth is in Jesus. You must give up your old way of life; you must put aside your old self, which gets corrupted by following illusory desires.

Your mind must be renewed by a spiritual revolution so that you can put on the new self that has been created in God's way, in the goodness and holiness of the truth

ACCLAMATION Alleluia, alleluia!

No one lives on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.
Alleluia!

HE GOSPEL John 6:24-35

When the people saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into boats and crossed to Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found him on the other side, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?'

Jesus answered: 'I tell you most solemnly,

you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs

but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat.

Do not work for food that cannot last,

but work for food that endures to eternal life,

the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you,

for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal.'

Then they said to him, 'What must we do if we are to do the works that God wants?' Jesus gave them this answer, 'This is working for God: you must believe in the one he has sent.' So they said, 'What sign will you give to show us that we should believe in you? What work will you do? Our fathers had manna to eat in the desert; as scripture says: He gave them bread from heaven to eat.' Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly,

it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven, the true bread;

for the bread of God

is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'

'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered:

'I am the bread of life.

He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.'
