FR. JOHN'S REFLECTION.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary this weekend we are reminded that the Doctrine of the Assumption speaks to us of Mary receiving the totality of the Resurrection in imitation of her Son; and it says that where she, the highest honour of our race has gone, we hope to follow. St Paul reminds us in the Second Reading that 'Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of all who have fallen asleep'. And this Truth is at the heart of today's celebration.

It is the ancient Tradition of the Church in both the East and the West that the Resurrection experience was gifted to the Mother of the Lord immediately after her death. Although no biblical texts exist for this Tradition, it is certainly in keeping with the thrust of Paul's Teaching. And, after all, the Scriptures do not contain the totality of God's Revelation, for to say otherwise would be to restrict the omnipotence of God!

I would like us to reflect today on three aspects of the life of Our Lady:

Mary remained faithful to the Gospel of her Son;

Mary followed the Lord in all things; and

Mary strove to live a good life and care for her neighbour.

In this she is an example for all of us... if we imitate her, then our destiny to be with her Son will become a reality.

We must imitate Mary in her perfect discipleship; we must strive to be like Mary in her holiness; and, like Mary we must do all we can to be faithful to God's will.

And one day we will shout aloud with Mary our Mother:

"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord and my spirit exults in God my savour"!

My friends, I trust you are continuing to do your best in these continuing days of Lockdown. I look forward to that day when we can gather together in person once again and celebrate the Liturgy, rejoicing in our shared faith in the Lord Jesus. In the meantime let's do our best to keep in contact with God through prayer, imitating our Lady and all the Saints in their good works.

May God continue to keep you all in the palm of his hand...



ST. MARY OF THE CROSS MACKILLOP YEAR B

ENTRANCE Come, you blessed of my Father, says the Lord: I was sick, and you visited me. Amen, I say to you: whatever you did for one of the least of my brethren, you did it for me.

FIRST READING 1 Kings 17:8-16

And then the word of the Lord came to Elijah, 'Up and go to Zarephath, a Sidonian town, and stay there. I have ordered a widow there to give you food.' So he went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring me a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives,' she replied 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel:

"Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied, before the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth."

The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

RESPONSE My soul clings to you; your right hand holds me fast.

SECOND READING Colossians 3:12-17

You are God's chosen race, his saints; he loves you, and you should be clothed in sincere compassion, in kindness and humility, gentleness and patience. Bear with one another; forgive each other as soon as a quarrel begins. The Lord has forgiven you; now you must do the same. Over all these clothes, to keep them together and complete them, put on love. And

may the peace of Christ reign in your hearts, because it is for this that you were called together as parts of one body. Always be thankful.

Let the message of Christ, in all its richness, find a home with you. Teach each other, and advise each other, in all wisdom. With gratitude in your hearts sing psalms and hymns and inspired songs to God; and never say or do anything except in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

ACCLAMATION Alleluia, alleluia!

Many women were there by the cross, watching from a distance, the same women who had followed Jesus and looked after him. Alleluia!

THE GOSPEL Matthew 6:23-34

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am telling you not to worry about your life and what you are to eat, nor about your body and how you are to clothe it. Surely life means more than food, and the body more than clothing! Look at the birds in the sky. They do not sow or reap or gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they are? Can any of you, for all his worrying, add one single cubit to his span of life? And why worry about clothing? Think of the flowers growing in the fields; they never have to work or spin; yet I assure you that not even Solomon in all his regalia was robed like one of these. Now if that is how God clothes the grass in the field which is there today and thrown into the furnace tomorrow, will he not much more look after you, you men of little faith? So do not worry; do not say, "What are we to eat? What are we to drink? How are we to be clothed?" It is the pagans who set their hearts on all these things. Your heavenly Father knows you need them all. Set your hearts on his kingdom first, and on his righteousness, and all these other things will be given you as well. So do not worry about tomorrow: tomorrow will take care of itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.'

COMMUNION This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another, says the Lord.
