FR. JOHN'S REFLECTION.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

The Readings chosen for this Sunday speak of three things for our consideration: Relationship, Choice, Covenant.

Relationship: it is always good to reflect on our relationship with the Lord, examining our faithfulness or otherwise. And such reflection on the way we live the Gospel leads us to make a

Choice: there are numerous occasions when we must imitate the People of Israel at Shechem, when we need to be like the Apostles, when we need to say 'yes' to the Lord. And this lead us to renew our Covenant with the Lord.

Covenant: this Semitic concept is all about commitment... God loves us and supports us always; are we willing to follow the Lord in all things?

Although it would be of great benefit for us to reflect on these three moments every day, we are also given the opportunity every time we celebrate the Mass. In the Penitential Rite we are able to

- * reflect on our relationship with the Father
- * choose to try and do better in the future
- * ask for the Spirit to renew our commitment to the Lord and the Gospel

And so, today let's imitate the People of Israel at Shechem; let's act in a way similar to the Apostles at Capernaum; let's make a change from a sometimes lukewarm and apathetic faith commitment to one that is on fire with Love for God and God's people! Let's say with St Peter:

"Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the word of everlasting life".

As we move into our third month of Lockdown, let us continue to pray for an end to the spread of this highly contagious Delta variant; indeed, let us pray that we can come out of this time of trial sooner rather than later. Furthermore, let us do whatever we can to support the Common Good through our own actions and decisions. Given the stricter rules in place at present, we all need to do our part to prevent the spread of this insidious disease.

Again, I thank those who have supported the parish with extra donations during this most difficult of times. We are about to receive the Government grant - better late than never! This will help pay the ongoing bills; and also enable us to look at improving our live-streaming Mass. Indeed, I hope to continue this practice of live-streaming the 10am Mass from St Canice's even after Lockdown. There are many in our community who would be grateful for this, as not everyone is able to attend Mass in person every week.

Finally, let us keep the people of Afghanistan in our prayers at this time; let's hope that there will not be widespread persecution and killing in the future. And let us hope that those in need - especially the women and children of Afghanistan - will receive the support and care that they need.

21ST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR B

ENTRANCE Turn your ear, O Lord, and answer me; save the servant who trusts in you, my God. Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I cry to you all the day long.

FIRST READING Joshua 24:1-2, 15-18

Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel together at Shechem; then he called the elders, leaders, judges and scribes of Israel, and they presented themselves before God. Then Joshua said to all the people, 'If you will not serve the Lord, choose today whom you wish to serve, whether the gods that your ancestors served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you are now living. As for me and my House, we will serve the Lord.'

The people answered, 'We have no intention of deserting the Lord and serving other gods! Was it not the Lord our God who brought us and our ancestors out of the land of Egypt, the house of slavery, who worked those great wonders before our eyes and preserved us all along the way we travelled and among all the peoples through whom we journeyed? What is more, the Lord drove all those peoples out before us, as well as the Amorites who used to live in this country. We too will serve the Lord, for he is our God.'

RESPONSE Tase and see the goodness of the Lord.

SECOND READING Ephesians 5:21-32

Give way to one another in obedience to Christ. Wives should regard their husbands as they regard the Lord, since as Christ is head of the Church and saves the whole body, so is a husband the head of his wife; and as the Church submits to Christ, so should wives to their husbands, in everything. Husbands should love their wives just as Christ loved the Church and sacrificed himself for her to make her holy. He made her clean by washing her in water with a form of words, so that when he took her to himself she would be glorious, with no speck or wrinkle or anything like that, but holy and faultless. In the same way, husbands must love their wives as they love their own bodies; for a man to love his wife is for him to love himself. A man never hates his own body, but he feeds it and looks after it; and that is the way Christ treats the Church, because it is his body – and we are its living parts. For this reason, a man must leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two will become one body. This mystery has many implications; but I am saying it applies to Christ and the Church.

ACCLAMATION Alleluia, alleluia!

Your words, Lord, are spirit and life: you have the words of everlasting life. Alleluia!

THE GOSPEL Luke 6:60-69

After hearing his doctrine many of the followers of Jesus said, 'This is intolerable language. How could anyone accept it?' Jesus was aware that his followers were complaining about it and said, 'Does this upset you? What if you should see the Son of Man ascend to where he was before?

'It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh has nothing to offer. The words I have spoken to you are spirit and they are life.

'But there are some of you who do not believe.' For Jesus knew from the outset those who did not believe, and who it was that would betray him. He went on, 'This is why I told you that no one could come to me unless the Father allows him.' After this, many of his disciples left him and stopped going with him.

Then Jesus said to the Twelve, 'What about you, do you want to go away too?' Simon Peter answered, 'Lord, who shall we go to? You have the message of eternal life, and we believe; we know that you are the Holy One of God.

COMMUNION Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, says the Lord, and I will raise him up on the last day.
