FR. JOHN'S REFLECTION.

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

The young man in today's gospel is challenged to move beyond the external keeping of the commandments - which are necessary -to a deeper following of the Lord and his Gospel of unconditional love.

Similarly, we are asked to follow Christ along his way of total obedience to the Will of God!

This will mean making certain that our Christian faith and it's praxis are not merely external actions but emanate from a rich spiritual relationship with the Lord.

Always a challenge, such teaching calls us to an ever-more intentional living out of discipleship.

In the coming week, let's do all we can to follow in the footsteps of our Master.

Reopening of Churches

Although we are permitted to reopen churches and chapels for private prayer from Monday 11th October, we will not be doing so until the State of NSW reaches the 80% fully vaccinated target.

This will avoid being discriminatory, as it would otherwise mean only fully vaccinated people can enter our churches and Adoration Chapel until the 80% target is reached.

When we do reopen, the 4 square metre rule will be in force, as will the compulsory wearing of masks. All people will be expected to check in via the QR code. Writing names on a list as before will not be the norm.

Furthermore, given the very infectious nature of the Delta variant, Fr Abraham and I have decided that will we not be giving communion on the tongue for the foreseeable future once masses resume.

This will avoid the possibility of aerosol droplets remaining on our hands as we take another host from the ciborium and give to the next communicant.

In addition, those receiving communion on the hand will need to keep their mask on until they have received the host from the minister, then take a few steps to one side, remove their mask, and then consume the host.

Again, this will lessen the danger of any COVID-19 transfer.

Finally, the 10am mass will continue to be live-streamed even after we emerge from lockdown as many parishioners will continue to be in isolation due to many different reasons. We are in unusual times, my friends. I look forward to the future when all this is but a memory. In the meantime, let's continue to keep each other in prayer.



ACCLAMATION Alleluia, alleluia! Happy the poor in spirit; the kingdom of heaven is theirs! Alleluia!

THE GOSPEL Mark 10:17-13

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.' Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth.

Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

Peter took this up. 'What about us?' he asked him. 'We have left everything and followed you.' Jesus said, 'I tell you solemnly, there is no one who has left house, brothers, sisters, father, children or land for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not be repaid a hundred times over, houses, brothers, sisters, mothers, children and land - not without persecutions now in this present time and, in the world to come, eternal life.'
