YEAR C | 26 June 2022 **Our Call & Response**

Dear Sisters and brothers,

Discipleship of the lord is the highest Christian perfection to which every Christian is called. The readings today shed light into different aspects of our response to God's calling to be the workers in the vineyard of the lord or to be Jesus' emissaries for the kingdom of God.

This Sunday's first reading is taken from I Kings chapter 19 where we see Elijah calling Elisha, by throwing his cloak on him. But Elisha requests permission of Elijah to bid farewell to his parents. Elijah allows Elisha the permission in an indirect way. And Elisha kills his oxen and breaks his yoke and uses it as firewood for cooking the meat and shares it with the people and comes and follows Elijah.

The second reading, this Sunday is taken from the letter of St Paul to Galatians where Paul says that we were called for freedom to serve one another through love. And he underlines the need to be guided by the spirit to be Jesus' disciples who are not under law.

The gospel reading for this Sunday is taken from Luke chapter 9. It also focuses on the different aspects of discipleship which Jesus is stressing. It narrates someone addressing Jesus says that he would follow Jesus wherever he goes. For this Jesus the master says, "foxes have dens, birds of the air have nests, but the son of man has nowhere to rest his head." To another Jesus Says, "follow me" But the one who is called requests the master permission to go and bury his father. But Jesus the master was not lenient to his request. He tells him to go and proclaim the kingdom of God. Another tells Jesus, he would follow him but requests permission to go and bid farewell to his family. Here also, Jesus answers rather negatively. "No one who sets a hand to plough and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."

All these readings speak of the need of proper dispositions of response to be the disciple of Jesus or what should be the dispositions of the disciple and response to belong to Jesus' fraternity. 'The call of the Lord to be his disciple' is that which requires an immediate, and sure response. The aged parents and their care, or bidding farewell to family members or settling family issues are not things that should become our priority for the response to god's call to his discipleship. The one who is called is invited to make an immediate and decisive response to the lord's bidding to be his disciple to preach the kingdom of God. This response to his call is the primary priority for the disciples of Jesus.

ENTRANCE All peoples, clap your hands to God with shouts of joy.

FIRST READING (I Kings 19:16,19-21)

The Lord said to Elijah, 'Go, you are to anoint Elisha son of Shaphat, of Abel Meholah, as prophet to succeed you.'

Leaving there, Elijah came on Elisha son of Shaphat as he was ploughing behind twelve yoke of oxen, he himself being with the twelfth. Elijah passed near to him and threw his cloak over him. Elisha left his oxen and ran after Elijah. 'Let me kiss my father and mother, then I will follow you' he said. Elijah answered, 'Go, go back; for have I done anything to you?' Elisha turned away, took the pair of oxen and slaughtered them. He used the plough for cooking the oxen, then gave to his men, who ate. He then rose, and followed Elijah and became his servant.

RESPONSE You are my inheritance, O Lord..

SECOND READING (Galatians 5:1,13-18)

When Christ freed us, he meant us to remain free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery. My brothers and sisters, you were called, as you know, to liberty; but be careful, or this liberty will provide an opening for selfindulgence. Serve one another, rather, in works of love, since the whole of the Law is summarised in a single command: Love your neighbour as yourself. If you go snapping at each other and tearing each other to pieces, you had better watch or you will destroy the whole community.

Let me put it like this: if you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to selfindulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you.

GOSPEL (Luke 9:51-62)

As the time drew near for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely took the road for Jerusalem and sent messengers ahead of him. These set out, and they went into a Samaritan village to make preparations for him, but the people would not receive him because he was making for Jerusalem. Seeing this, the disciples James and John said, 'Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to burn them up?' But he turned and rebuked them, and they went off to another village.

As they travelled along they met a man on the road who said to him, 'I will follow you wherever you go.' Jesus answered, 'Foxes have holes and the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.'
