Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

The great Parable of the Sower and the Seeds in our Gospel Reading from Matthew for today encourages us to keep on striving to sow the message of Christ in soul that will bear fruit in abundance. And the fruitfulness of that soil will vary at different stages of our life: one hundred fold, sixty, thirty...

But, overall, despite thorns, birds, and rocky paths... we must keep going forward, never giving up, never despairing.

In prayer and times of reflection, let's open our hearts and minds to God, so that the Word may take root in us and help us grow in Faith and Love all our days!

And we have the words of St Paul in our Second Reading to encourage us in this endeavour: "I think that what we suffer in this life can never be compared to the glory, as yet I revealed, which is waiting for us."

And indeed, the words from Isaiah in our First Reading are a call to conversion which underlines the effectiveness of the Word of God which brings about in the end what it was sent to do:

Thus says the Lord: 'As the rain and the snow come down from the heavens and do not return without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the sower and bread for the eating, so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do.'

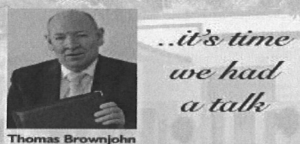

15TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A

ENTRANCE As for me, in justice I shall behold your face; I shall be filled with the vision of your glory.

FIRST READING (Isaiah 55:10-11)

Thus says the Lord: 'As the rain and the snow come down from the heavens and do not return without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the sower and bread for the eating, so the word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do.'

RESPONSE The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest.

SECOND READING (Romans 8:18-23)

I think that what we suffer in this life can never be compared to the glory, as yet unrevealed, which is waiting for us. The whole creation is eagerly waiting for God to reveal his children. It was not for any fault on the part of creation that it was made unable to attain its purpose, it was made so by God; but creation still retains the hope of being freed, like us, from its slavery to decadence, to enjoy the same freedom and glory as the children of God. From the beginning till now the entire creation, as we know, has been groaning in one great act of giving birth; and not only creation, but all of us who possess the first-fruits of the Spirit, we too groan inwardly as we wait for our bodies to be set free.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!

The seed is the word of God, Christ is the Sower; all who come to him will live for ever.

Alleluia!

GOSPEL (Matthew 13:1-23)

Jesus left the house and sat by the lakeside, but such large crowds gathered round him that he got into a boat and sat there. The people all stood on the beach, and he told them many things in parables.

He said, 'Imagine a sower going out to sow. As he sowed, some seeds fell on the edge of the path, and the birds came and ate them up. Others fell on patches of rock where they found little soil and sprang up straight away, because there was no depth of earth; but as soon as the sun came up they were scorched

and, not having any roots, they withered away. Others fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked them. Others fell on rich soil and produced their crop, some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty. Listen, anyone who has ears!'

Then the disciples went up to him and asked, 'Why do you talk to them in parables?' 'Because' he replied, 'the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven are revealed to you, but they are not revealed to them. For anyone who has will be given more, and they will have more than enough; but from anyone who has not, even what they have will be taken away. The reason I talk to them in parables is that they look without seeing and listen without hearing or understanding. So in their case this prophecy of Isaiah is being fulfilled:

You will listen and listen again, but not understand, see and see again, but not perceive. For the heart of this nation has grown coarse, their ears are dull of hearing, and they have shut their eyes, for fear they should see with their eyes, hear with their ears, understand with their heart, and be converted and be healed by me.

'But blessed are your eyes because they see, your ears because they hear! I tell you solemnly, many prophets and holy ones longed to see what you see, and never saw it; to hear what you hear, and never heard it.

'You, therefore, are to hear the parable of the sower. When anyone hears the word of the kingdom without understanding, the evil one comes and carries off what was sown in their heart: this is the one who received the seed on the edge of the path. The one who received it on patches of rock is the person who hears the word and welcomes it at once with joy. But they have no root in them, they do not last; let some trial come, or some persecution on account of the word, and they fall away at once. The one who received the seed in thorns is the one who hears the word, but the worries of this world and the lure of riches choke the word and so they produce nothing. And the one who received the seed in rich soil is the one who hears the word and understands it; they are the one who yield a harvest and produces now a hundredfold, now sixty, now thirty.'

COMMUNION
