Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

The message of this Sunday's readings is forgiveness.

The message is clear, as it is in the "Our Father", if we don't forgive, we won't be forgiven.

Jesus also makes it clear in His parable that we have no means of making good on what we have done.

Each and every sin has broad and far-reaching consequences. It affects us, it affects the people around us and through them it goes on affecting people way beyond our social reach.

Sin affects us and others particularly because it affects attitudes, and even if it constitutes a small shift in attitude, it will increasingly lead down a certain path of thought, word and action.

It will in effect cause a snowball effect of unhealthy attitudes in a person if not stopped.

This is where God's forgiveness cuts in. He can stop the snowball, He can reverse the trend through the presence of the Holy Spirit.

God does not forget sin, nor minimise the seriousness. Rather He heals us because He wants the best for us. He knows we have faults and weakness because we are human, because we live in an imperfect world.

We are made in His image and likeness. We too must care for everyone we have contact or dealings with.

We members of the Body of Christ in this world through which the Spirit enters this world and so we need to forgive.

We need to train ourselves to start to see like God sees, that other people have their weaknesses and problems because of their environment and genetics but ours in not to condemn or dole out punishment, but rather bring healing.

This means that we do not bare any grudges, ill feelings, or resentments. We may not be able to associate with certain people, but we must never wish them any ill will.

Any time that an idea or inclination enters our mind which desires some form of retribution or discomfort or harm to another because of something they have said or done, this must be quashed. Say a pray asking God to be freed from this resentment.

Just as the resentful wishes taint and twist our character and attitudes, so too do positive thoughts of wanting to help another. By concentrating on the positive thoughts of good will we will be healing our attitudes through the graces of God and these attitudes will effect those around us and through them those far beyond our social reach.




SAFEGUARDING FACE-TO-FACE TRAINING OPPORTUNI-TIES AT ST CANICE'S CHURCH KATOOMBA

24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME YEAR A

<u>ENTRANCE</u> Give peace, O Lord, to those who wait for you, that your prophets be found true. Hear the prayers of your servant, and of your people.

FIRST READING (Ezekiel Ecclesiasticus 27:30-28:7)

Resentment and anger, these are foul things, and both are found with the sinner. The one who exacts vengeance will experience the vengeance of the Lord, who keeps strict account of sin. Forgive your neighbour the hurt they do you, and when you pray, your sins will be forgiven. If one nurses anger against another, can one then demand compassion from the Lord? Showing no pity for anyone like themselves like himself, can they then plead for their own sins? Mere creature of flesh, they cherish resentment; who will forgive them their sins? Remember the last things, and stop hating, remember dissolution and death, and live by the commandments. Remember the commandments, and do not bear your neighbour ill-will; remember the covenant of the Most High, and overlook the offence.

<u>RESPONSE</u> The Lord is kind and merciful; slow to anger and rich in compassion.

SECOND READING (Romans 14:7-9)

The life and death of each of us has its influence on others; if we live, we live for the Lord; and if we die, we die for the Lord, so that alive or dead we belong to the Lord. This explains why Christ both died and came to life: it was so that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living.





GOSPEL (Matthew 18:21-35)

Peter went up to Jesus and said, 'Lord, how often must I forgive my brother or sister if they wrong me? As often as seven times?' Jesus answered, 'Not seven, I tell you, but seventy-seven times.

'And so the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who decided to settle his accounts with his servants. When the reckoning began, they brought him a man who owed ten thousand talents; but he had no means of paying, so his master gave orders that he should be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, to meet the debt. At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time" he said "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me" he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saying, "Give me time and I will pay you." But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt. His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother or sister from your heart.'

COMMUNION

The chalice of blessing that we bless is a communion in the Blood of Christ and the bread we break is a sharing in the Body of the Lord.
