Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

In the readings this week Isaiah, St Paul and St Peter all see their sinfulness, but they also all respond to the call of God.

And God calls, not despite their sinfulness but rather because of it.

It's a very clear message for us. We are all called to work with God to bring about the new heaven and new earth, but we need to acknowledge that we have issues so that the grace of God can help us overcome our faults and move into a positive, creative way of living.

Like Isaiah we have heard and, in some way, experienced God in our lives. Jesus is the revelation of God and as we develop a relationship with Him, we experience Him, we experience God. His love and His call.

But we also feel that we are so far from Christlike that it's almost hopeless. But it's not.

This feeling of unholiness is the mourning that the beatitudes which says, "happy are they that mourns" talks of. It's a deep sadness and regret that we are the way we are. It's a mourning for the fact that our true self, that which we are created to be, the image and likeness of God is somewhat dead, in a dormant state. But that's just it, it's not dead, it's in a dormant state and all it needs is the burning coal brought to us by the angel to wake us up.

The burning coal, the fiery element is the Holy Spirit which burns away all sin and empowers us to live more and more in harmony with God.

Living in harmony with God is us answering the call. It's us evangelising by the way we work and the way we interact with people. It doesn't matter what we are doing so long we intend to do the best for the people we are serving by our actions. To ensure our intent is open and correct we work on a relationship with God and pray for the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

OUR LADY OF LOURDES

Each year over 2 million people make their way through the mountainous country of southeastern France to Lourdes. They come seeking cures, hoping to find answers, believing, and praying. At Lourdes, people recall the Lady dressed in white, with a blue sash, yellow roses at her feet, and a Rosary on her arm—the Virgin Mary.

On February 11, 1858, Mary appeared to 14-year-old Bernadette Soubirous. This was the first of 18 visits, many of them with 20,000 people present. When Bernadette asked the Lady's identity, she replied, "I am the Immaculate Conception." Just four years earlier, the pope had proclaimed it a dogma that Mary was conceived immaculate without original sin. The Virgin Mary, through Bernadette, had come to call sinners to a change of heart. Her message was a request for prayer and penance. She also instructed Bernadette to tell the priests that a chapel was to be built on the site and processions held.

On February 25, 1858, the Lady told Bernadette to dig in the dirt and drink of the stream. Bernadette began to dig, and after several attempts she was able to find the water to drink. The water continued to flow from where she had dug with her hands until it was producing over 32,000 gallons of water a day—as it still does. There have been over 5,000 cures recorded but less than 100 of them have been declared miraculous by the Church. Most of these have taken place during the blessing with the Blessed Sacrament.

We may never travel to Lourdes and join in the processions, but we can know always that we have a Mother to help us and lead us to her Son, Jesus.



5TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME C

ENTRANCE

O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

FIRST READING (Isaiah 6:1-8)

In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord seated on a high throne; his train filled the sanctuary; above him stood seraphs, each one with six wings. And they cried out one to another in this way, 'Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts. His glory fills the whole earth.'

The foundations of the threshold shook with the voice of the one who cried out, and the Temple was filled with smoke. I said: 'What a wretched state I am in! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have looked at the King, the Lord of hosts.'

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding in his hand a live coal which he had taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. With this he touched my mouth and said: 'See now, this has touched your lips, your sin is taken away, your iniquity is purged.'

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying: 'Whom shall I send? Who will be our messenger?' I answered, 'Here I am, send me.'

<u>RESPONSE</u> In the sight of the angels I will sing your praises, Lord.

SECOND READING (1 Corinthians 15:1-11)

Brothers and sisters, I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, the gospel that you received and in which you are firmly established; because the gospel will save you only if you keep believing exactly what I preached to you - believing anything else will not lead to anything.

Well then, in the first place, I taught you what I had been taught myself, namely that Christ died for our sins, in accordance with the scriptures; that he was buried; and that he was raised to life on the third day, in accordance with the scriptures; that he appeared first to Cephas and secondly to the Twelve. Next he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died; then he appeared to James, and then to all the apostles; and last of all he

appeared to me too; it was as though I was born when no one expected it.

I am the least of the apostles; in fact, since I persecuted the Church of God, I hardly deserve the name apostle; but by God's grace that is what I am, and the grace that he gave me has not been fruitless. On the contrary, I, or rather the grace of God that is with me, have worked harder than any of the others; but what matters is that I preach what they preach, and this is what you all believed.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!
Come follow me, says the Lord,
and I will make you fishers of my people.
Alleluia!

GOSPEL (Luke 5:1-11)

Jesus was standing one day by the Lake of Gennesaret, with the crowd pressing round him listening to the word of God, when he caught sight of two boats close to the bank. The fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats it was Simon's - and asked him to put out a little from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat.

When he had finished speaking he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water and pay out your nets for a catch.' 'Master,' Simon replied 'we worked hard all night long and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will pay out the nets.' And when they had done this they netted such a huge number of fish that their nets began to tear, so they signalled to their companions in the other boat to come and help them; when these came, they filled the two boats to sinking point.

When Simon Peter saw this he fell at the knees of Jesus saying, 'Leave me, Lord; I am a sinful man.' For he and all his companions were completely overcome by the catch they had made; so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were Simon's partners. But Jesus said to Simon, 'Do not be afraid; from now on it is people you will catch.' Then, bringing their boats back to land, they left everything and followed him.

COMMUNION

Let them thank the Lord for his mercy, his wonders for the children of men, for he satisfies the thirsty soul, and the hungry he fills with good things.
