YEAR C - 23 March 2025

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ

The first reading we hear how God identifies Himself as the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. These fathers of faith are alive as Christ points out in Matthew 22:32.

It is in this light that we need to see what is meant by death in these readings. Death in these readings means SPIRITUAL DEATH.

Abraham, Isaac and Jacob are all physically dead, but yet they are alive.

The people that are described as dead in these readings are spiritually dead. According to the second reading they are dead because they "all ate the same spiritual food and all drank the same spiritual drink, since they all drank from the spiritual rock that followed them as they went, and that rock was Christ. In spite of this, most of them failed to please God and their corpses littered the desert". This is a warning to us!

This brings us to the Gospel; we don't want to be the fig tree in the Gospel. The fig tree in Scriptures represents the people of Israel. In the Gospel Christ tells the parable of the fig tree that bears no fruit and which will be cut down unless it produces some fruit. This is very important, because it ties in with Christ actually cursing the fig tree, which is full of leaves but has no fruit, on His way to Jerusalem (Mark 11:12-14) saying: "May no one ever eat fruit from you again." This can be seen as a judgement on the people that had many rules, ceremonies, rituals and protocols (the leaves) but no trust in God and consequently no empathy, compassion and love (fruit).

So, let's start digging and manuring to get some fruit going, or more fruit going. Let's contemplate on God's love, see how much He has done and continues to do for us and start to turn our lives over to Him. Turn our lives outwards because we live our life through our Lord.


KATOOMBA GARDEN WORKING BEE

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3RD SUNDAY OF LENT ORDINARY TIME C

ENTRANCE

My eyes are always on the Lord, for he rescues my feet from the snare. Turn to me and have mercy on me, for I am alone and poor.

FIRST READING (Exodus 3:1-8, 13-15)

Moses was looking after the flock of Jethro, his father-inlaw, priest of Midian. He led his flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. There the angel of the Lord appeared to him in the shape of a flame of fire, coming from the middle of a bush. Moses looked; there was the bush blazing but it was not being burnt up. 'I must go and look at this strange sight,' Moses said 'and see why the bush is not burnt.' Now the Lord saw him go forward to look, and God called to him from the middle of the bush. 'Moses, Moses!' he said. 'Here I am,' he answered. 'Come no nearer,' he said. 'Take off your shoes, for the place on which you stand is holy ground. I am the God of your father,' he said 'the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob.' At this Moses covered his face, afraid to look at God.

And the Lord said, 'I have seen the miserable state of my people in Egypt. I have heard their appeal to be free of their slave-drivers. Yes, I am well aware of their sufferings. I mean to deliver them out of the hands of the Egyptians and bring them up out of that land to a land rich and broad, a land where milk and honey flow.'

Then Moses said to God, 'I am to go, then, to the children of Israel and say to them, "The God of your ancestors has sent me to you." But if they ask me what his name is, what am I to tell them?' And God said to Moses, 'I Am who I Am. This' he added 'is what you must say to the children of Israel: "The Lord, the God of your ancestors, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you." This is my name for all time; by this name I shall be invoked for all generations to come.'

RESPONSE The Lord is kind and merciful.

SECOND READING (1 Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12)

I want to remind you how our ancestors were all guided by a cloud above them and how they all passed through the sea. They were all baptised into Moses in this cloud and in this sea; all ate the same spiritual food and all drank the same spiritual drink, since they all drank from the spiritual rock that followed them as they went, and that rock was Christ. In spite of this, most of them failed to please God and their corpses littered the desert.

These things all happened as warnings for us, not to have the wicked lusts for forbidden things that they had. You must never complain: some of them did, and they were killed by the Destroyer.

All this happened to them as a warning, and it was written down to be a lesson for us who are living at the end of the age. Those who think they are safe must be careful that they do not fall.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ! Repent, says the Lord; the kingdom of heaven is at hand. Glory to you, Word of God, Lord Jesus Christ!

GOSPEL (Luke 13:1-9)

Some people arrived and told Jesus about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with that of their sacrifices. At this he said to them, 'Do you suppose these Galileans who suffered like that were greater sinners than any other Galileans? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did. Or those eighteen on whom the tower at Siloam fell and killed them? Do you suppose that they were more guilty than all the other people living in Jerusalem? They were not, I tell you. No; but unless you repent you will all perish as they did.'

He told this parable: 'A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard and he came looking for fruit on it but found none. He said to the man who looked after the vineyard, "Look here, for three years now I have been coming to look for fruit on this fig tree and finding none. Cut it down: why should it be taking up the ground?" "Sir," the man replied "leave it one more year and give me time to dig round it and manure it: it may bear fruit next year; if not, then you can cut it down.""
